HISTORY OF OUR CHURCH

On January 15, 1981, Steve & Diana Shafe answered the call to plant a church in Albion by relocating their family (2 daughters) from Battle Creek to Albion, MI. They began their ministry with a midweek Bible Study meeting in their mobile home at the Twin Pines Mobile Home Park called a Care Group Bible Study. Later that year on Sunday May 17, 1981, the first public worship service was held at the former Albion Holiday Inn with 39 people in attendance, half of whom were family and friends from Battle Creek. The church continued to meet in the Holiday Inn for the rest of 1981 with average attendance in the 20's.

In January of 1982, the church began meeting in rented space at the First United Methodist Church of Albion. This would be our home for nearly ten years. In May 1985, the church was officially organized as a Wesleyan Church. Five years later in July 1990 the church paid cash for 23 acres of land on Irwin Avenue in Albion which is our current location.

A groundbreaking for the original facility was in April 1991 with site preparation starting immediately and construction of the building beginning in August 1991. The first service in the new facility was December 22, 1991. The congregation met at the United Methodist Church for the last time to walk the 2.1 miles to our first service in our new facility. The church went from paying \$235 per month in rent to a mortgage of \$3,500 per month plus utilities!

Worship saw a dynamic change in 1997 with a worship director and team structure for leading and directing the music during service. As the church continued to grow in 1999 the church engaged in a church-wide Experiencing God study which had a significant spiritual impact on the church. It is also noted that between 1999 and 2002, the church tried to engage a part-time youth pastor but would revert back to a volunteer driven youth leadership team.

In the spring 2002, due to sacrificial giving and good stewardship, the church was able to pay off the mortgage almost 4.5 years early. In 2003, the church embraced its first vision statement. As the church continued to grow in 2012 the part-time Volunteer Coordinator position was created and subsequently filled in 2013 following a series of messages titled "The Best Is Yet to Come" focusing on People, Places and Programs.

Then in 2014, the Local Board of Administration, sensing God's prompting in the need for a larger facility to address the People, Places and Program needs of a growing church, formed a building committee. Soon a capital campaign titled "Caring for the Generations", to expand the existing facility was initiated. Also of note in this time was a series of messages on "The Blessed Life" which saw a significant increase in sustained giving which would persist to the present day.

On October 18, 2015, the church broke ground on the facility expansion and shifted worship temporarily to "Caring Community South Campus" in the barn of one of the members. The first service in the expanded facility was March 2016. The church is currently on target to retire this debt six years early.

In 2016, the LBA began to focus and sustained focus on succession planning and planning for sabbatical resulting in a shift of duties and responsibilities from the pastor to LBA. In 2021 the church celebrated its 40th anniversary and with God leading the way we will continue to serve others.

BY PROVIDING BASIC NEEDS SUCH AS CLOTHING OR DIAPERS, WE CAN ALLOW THE FAMILY TO JUST FOCUS ON LOVING AND CUDDLING THEIR CHILD FOR THE FIRST 2-3 DAYS RATHER THAN STRESSING ABOUT THEIR CLOTHING NEEDS.

REASON FOR SERVING: THIS WAS THE RESULT OF WORK BY A GROUP OF FOLKS IN OUR CHURCH BACK IN 2003 AND 2004 REGARDING HOW TO ADDRESS THE NEEDS WE PERCEIVED IN OUR BODY OF BELIEVERS. THE CONSENSUS WAS THAT WE NEEDED TO START SMALL GROUP BIBLE STUDIES TO HELP MAKE OUR CHURCH GROW IN NUMBERS, SPIRITUALLY, AND IN COMMUNITY. AT THAT TIME, THIS GROUP ALSO WORKED ON A GUIDE OF EXPECTATIONS FOR SMALL GROUP LEADERS. AS A RESULT OF THIS WORK, TWO HOME BIBLE STUDIES WERE STARTED. ONE IN OUR HOME ON THE 1ST AND 3RD TUESDAYS OF EACH MONTH AND ONE IN THE REEVES HOME ON DIFFERENT DAYS. OUR GROUP HAS BEEN MEETING EACH MONTH IN THIS FASHION SINCE THAT TIME. WE NORMALLY DISCONTINUED FOR THE SUMMER MONTHS AND THEN RESUMED IN SEPTEMBER.

VOLUNTEERISM

CARING COMMUNITY CHURCH HAS ALWAYS BEEN A VOLUNTEER-BASED CHURCH. VOLUNTEERISM IS WIDESPREAD IN MANY DIFFERENT AREAS SUCH AS TEACHING IN CHILDREN'S MINISTRY, CLEANING TEAMS, WORSHIP TEAM, TECH TEAM AND MANY OTHER AREAS. BECAUSE OF THOSE WHO ATTEND AND VOLUNTEER THE CHURCH HAS BENEFITED IN BEING ABLE TO AFFORD AND MANAGE OUR FACILITY.

COMMUNITY INFORMATION

DURING THE LAST 5 YEARS, THE COMMUNITY HAS BEEN EXPERIENCING A REVITALIZATION THROUGH THE EFFORTS AND VISION OF SEVERAL LOCAL BUSINESS OWNERS AND THE COLLEGE LEADERSHIP. THIS HAS RESULTED IN THE NEW MARRIOTT COURTYARD HOTEL DOWNTOWN, THE REOPENING OF THE BOHM THEATRE, A RESURGENCE OF LIVE MUSIC, AND THE RENOVATION OF DOWNTOWN BUILDINGS WITH HOUSING AND STOREFRONTS.







THE ALBION PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM WAS ANNEXED TO NEIGHBORING MARSHALL PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN 2013. LOCAL SCHOOLS OF CHOICE INCLUDE HOMER, SPRINGPORT, MARSHALL OPPORTUNITY, MARSHALL ACADEMY, MAR LEE, AND CONCORD SCHOOLS. THE SCHOOL SYSTEM DOES MAINTAIN AN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN THE CITY OF ALBION.

ALBION IS HOME OF ALBION COLLEGE, A 4-YEAR LIBERAL ARTS COLLEGE LISTED IN THE TOP 25% OF COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES IN THE NATION. ALBION COLLEGE AND ALBION COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP DEVELOPMENTS INCLUDE YMCA PROGRAMMING, ALONG WITH SPACES FOR COMMUNITY AND COLLEGE IN THE WASHINGTON GARDNER BUILDING LOCATED DOWNTOWN. THE COLLEGE IS PLANNING A RENOVATION OF THE WASHINGTON GARDNER FACILITY CREATING THE BODY AND SOUL CENTER, A PLACE FOR COMMUNITY AND COLLEGE ENGAGEMENT IN WELLNESS AND THE ARTS. KELLOGG COMMUNITY COLLEGE LOCATED IN BATTLE CREEK HAS A SATELLITE CAMPUS JUST TO THE WEST OF ALBION IN WHICH THEY OFFER SEVERAL OF THEIR COURSES. WE FREQUENTLY HAVE COLLEGE STUDENTS ATTEND AND PARTICIPATE IN OUR MINISTRY.





LOCAL COMMUNITY

ALBION OFFERS MANY OUTDOOR ACTIVITY OPTIONS INCLUDING A PROFESSIONAL DISC GOLF COURSE IN VICTORY PARK, HIKING TRAILS (PART OF THE NORTH COUNTRY TRAIL), KAYAKING AND CANOEING ON THE KALAMAZOO RIVER, MULTIPLE COMMUNITY PARKS, FESTIVALS AND EVENTS & ATTRACTIONS INCLUDE FESTIVAL OF THE FORKS, BLUES AT THE BOHM, SWINGING AT THE SHELL, FARMER'S MARKET WITH LIVE MUSIC, WALK THE BEAT MUSIC FESTIVAL, ALBION COMMUNITY THEATRE GROUP, COLLEGE FINE ARTS PROGRAMMING, AND COLLEGE ATHLETICS.

HOSPITALS SERVING THE AREA ARE OAKLAWN HOSPITAL IN MARSHALL, HENRY FORD ALLEGIANCE IN JACKSON AND SPARROW AND MCLAREN HOSPITAL IN LANSING. OAKLAWN HOSPITAL MAINTAINS AN EXPRESS AND URGENT CARE CLINIC WITHIN THE CITY OF ALBION.







IMPACT OF COVID-19

CARING COMMUNITY CHURCH WAS SHUT DOWN PER MICHIGAN COVID GUIDELINES IN MARCH OF 2020 AND UNABLE TO HOLD IN PERSON SERVICE. THAT DID NOT STOP US FROM GETTING OUR MESSAGE OUT. THE MESSAGE FROM THE PULPIT WAS DELIVERED IN MANY WAYS. MESSAGES WERE RECORDED AND PLACED ON SOCIAL MEDIA AND WE HAD A PARKING LOT SERVICE AS WE KEPT OUR POLICY OF SOCIAL DISTANCING. WE ALSO OBTAINED A LOCAL RADIO STATION TO BROADCAST THE MESSAGE. WE CONTINUED TO FOLLOW THE GUIDELINES AND WERE ABLE TO HOLD IN PERSON SERVICE WITH SOCIAL DISTANCING AND WEARING MASKS BY THE END OF MAY 2020. THE CHILDREN'S MINISTRY FOLLOWED THE GUIDELINES USED BY THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION.

THE IMPACT OF COVID-19 HAS AFFECTED US ALL IN ONE WAY OR ANOTHER. WITH THE RESILIENCE OF THE CONGREGATION'S CONTINUED FINANCIAL SUPPORT, CARING COMMUNITY CHURCH WAS BLESSED TO RECEIVE ABOVE AND BEYOND OUR BUDGETARY NEEDS DURING THIS TIME OF HARDSHIP. GOD IS GOOD.

DEMOGRAPHICS

ALBION IS A CITY IN CALHOUN COUNTY IN THE SOUTH-CENTRAL REGION OF THE LOWER PENINSULA OF THE U.S. STATE OF MICHIGAN AND WAS FOUNDED IN 1885. THE POPULATION WAS 8.616 AT THE 2010 CENSUS AND IS PART OF THE BATTLE CREEK METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA. ACCORDING TO THAT CENSUS THE MEDIAN INCOME FOR ALBION IS \$34,467. THE POPULATION BREAKDOWN IS AS FOLLOWS: WHITE 62%, BLACK 30%, HISPANIC 7%, OTHER 1%. ALBION HAS APPROXIMATELY 30 CHURCHES WITHIN ITS COMMUNITY.

ALBION. MICHIGAN IS LOCATED ON THE FORKS OF THE KALAMAZOO RIVER. HISTORICALLY ALBION WAS A METAL CASTING INDUSTRY COMMUNITY. ALBION SAW ECONOMIC AND POPULATION DECLINES THROUGH THE 70'S AND 80'S DUE TO THE LOSS OF THE CASTING INDUSTRY. THE POPULATION AS OF 2019 WAS 8,336.

ALBION IS A HEAVY AGRICULTURAL AREA. LARGER CITIES WHICH HAVE LARGE BOX STORES, SHOPPING MALLS, RESTAURANTS, ENTERTAINMENT ARE WITHIN EASY DRIVING DISTANCE WHICH CONSIST OF JACKSON (23 MILES), BATTLE CREEK (28 MILES), KALAMAZOO (47 MILES), LANSING (55 MILES), ANN ARBOR (45 MILES), DETROIT (96 MILES), GRAND RAPIDS (100 MILES), CHICAGO (195 MILES). ALBION ALSO HAS A TRAIN AND BUS STATION FOR TRANSPORTATION LOCATED DOWNTOWN. IN ADDITION TO THE ALBION COMMUNITY, CARING COMMUNITY DRAWS ATTENDANCE FROM CONCORD, HOMER, JACKSON, MARSHALL, SPRING ARBOR, AND SPRINGPORT.




MEMBERSHIP AND BUDGET

WE CURRENTLY HAVE 53 MEMBERS IN THE CONGREGATION WHILE OVERSEEING 75+ EACH SUNDAY. THESE NUMBERS WERE HIGHER BEFORE COVID, BUT WE CONTINUE TO MAKE PROGRESS.



OUR BUDGET HAS COME IN AROUND \$220,000 THE LAST FEW YEARS WITH A CONSISTENT AVERAGE THAT IS APPLIED WHERE THE LBA DETERMINES.



BUILDING PROJECT

IN 2014, THE LBA SENSED GOD'S PROMPTING FOR A LARGER FACILITY, TO ADDRESS PEOPLE, PLACES AND PROGRAM NEEDS OF A GROWING CHURCH. A BUILDING COMMITTEE WAS FORMED AND A CAPITAL CAMPAIGN TITLED "CARING FOR THE GENERATIONS" WAS LAUNCHED. THE COMMITTEE DISCUSSED, EXPLORED, AND PLANNED THE EXPANSION OF THE EXISTING FACILITY. DURING THIS TIME, A SERIES OF MESSAGES ON THE BLESSED LIFE WHICH RESULTED IN A SIGNIFICANT INCREASE IN SUSTAINED GIVING WHICH PERSIST TO THIS PRESENT DAY.

OCTOBER 18, 2015 THE CHRUCH BROKE GROUND ON THE FACILITY EXPANSION AND SHIFTED WORSHIP TEMPORARY TO "CARING COMMUNITY SOUTH CAMPUS" IN THE BARN OF ONE OF OUR MEMBERS. THE FIRST SERVICE IN THE EXPANDED FACILITY WAS HELD IN MARCH 2016. OUR DEBT FOR THE EXPANSION WAS OVER \$600,000. DUE TO THE CONTINUED GIVING, EXTRA PAYMENTS HAVE BEEN MADE OVER THE YEARS. IN 2021, WE HAD OUR 40TH ANNIVERSARY AND THE LBA ISSUED A CHALLENGE TO RAISE \$30,000 WITH A BOARD MATCH OF \$30,000 TO HELP LOWER OUR DEBT. AS A RESULT OF THE CHALLENGE, OVER \$42,000 WAS RAISED FOR A TOTAL PAYMENT OF \$72,000 ALLOWING THE CHURCH TO RETIRE THE DEBT 6 YEARS EARLY.

CARING COMMUNITY CHURCH PASTOR PROFILE

PERSONAL QUALITIES

- 1. Committed and mature follower of Jesus Christ with a consistent and deep life of prayer and time in God's Word that is continuously growing and developing.
- 2. Demonstrates a personal passion and commitment for evangelism, outreach, and discipleship with evidence in their personal life.
- 3. If married, must be deeply committed to family and maintains healthy boundaries on behalf of the family.
- 4. The pastor should clearly seek to build and invest in relationships, especially with the people the pastor is responsible to lead.

PROFESSIONAL QUALITIES

- 1. Must fully embrace the Bible as the Word of God, in alignment with Wesleyan theology.
- 2. Has a sound theological education with a minimum of a bachelor's degree, preferred Master's but not required.
- 3. Must be ordained in an acceptable denomination or be in the ordination track with the Wesleyan Church. (see Wesleyan Church Guidelines)
- 4. Excellent record of leadership success in the church preferably as the Lead Pastor.
- 5. Strongly recommend the candidate has served in a Pastoral role a minimum of 3-5 years in a local church.

PASTORAL QUALITIES AND ROLES

Community Engagement

This person will be a relational leader who values partnership development and intentional community engagement. The pastor will communicate the vision of the church to the community as well as investing in, and building partnerships with, local churches, businesses, and local government. They will be Kingdom oriented and value unity over uniformity.

Enthusiastic Alignment with the Church's Mission and Core Values

It is essential that the pastor is excited and in alignment with the stated mission of the church. The pastor must also wholeheartedly believe in and lead the practice of our stated core values. The Pastor must believe in the mission of Caring Community Church.

Effective Preacher/Teacher

Must fully embrace the Bible as the Word of God. The pastor should be able to clearly and passionately communicate biblical truth through sermons that connect to both believers and non-believers. Messages should be creative, engaging, filled with practical application and presented in such a way that the people find them motivating, challenging, helpful, and convicted. Sermons should spark passion, action, and be relevant to all ages.

Reliable: faithful to commitments

The church leadership, in addition to the congregation as a whole, views the pastor as faithful to commitments and decisions. The pastor should be a person who can be relied upon to have deep integrity.

Competent in Facing Challenges and Conflicts

The pastor should be faithful, dependable, and even-keeled in challenging times. Tough conversations, including addressing conflict, should be managed in a timely manner with grace and kindness, speaking the truth in love.

Demonstrates Dependence on the Holy Spirit

The pastor must demonstrate an eagerness to invite the Holy Spirit to be released in great power and demonstrate an eagerness to depend on the leadership of the Holy Spirit in leading the ministry of the church.

LEADERSHIP QUALITIES AND ROLES

Leader

The pastor has a demonstrated gift of organizational leadership. This results in leading and equipping the board, staff, volunteers, finances, vision, etc. and must be committed to leadership development in others. The pastor's leadership makes others better.

Leader: collaboratively develop, cast, and implement vision

The pastor must have experience and be effective at all phases of vision casting for the church and must be willing and able to operate in a collaborative approach.

Staff/Volunteer Leadership

Must have experience effectively leading a multi-person ministry. This will be demonstrated by the ability to direct staff/volunteers, form a cohesive team, empower staff/volunteers in the execution of their responsibilities and guide individuals to develop their personal areas of giftedness.

Consensus Building: a leader who will form, equip and lead teams of leaders

The pastor will equip the staff, the board, other leaders in the church, and the congregation in a collaborative spirit. The pastor should be able to lead assertively and yet demonstrate flexibility within reasonable boundaries to achieve "ownership" from the teams in an effort to achieve common goals.

Effective Communicator: communicates in a compelling manner

The pastor should be able to communicate clearly and passionately, both written and verbally, to large and small audiences. Communication should be timely and informative. Feedback should be solicited regularly so communications can be corrected or repeated as needed. Communication to the staff, the leadership of the church, and the congregation concerning vision and future direction should be motivating so that people want to be part of the future direction of the church.

Follow Through: caring tasks to completion

The pastor must ensure that follow through happens on decisions that are made. It is not necessary that the pastor personally carry out those tasks to completion. However, it is necessary that the pastor recognize the need to follow through by seeing that the staff and church leaders efficiently carry out tasks.

Courageous in creating opportunities

The pastor must be willing to try new and innovative things, take obedient risks, test new waters, and go after the mission in creative and yet responsible ways. This should be done in the context of being a consensus-building leader and also as a networker with peers outside the church to leverage the collective wisdom of others facing similar opportunities.

Intergenerational Ministry

The pastor must be committed to reaching multiple generations and finding ways to reach out to all generations.
